PRESS RELEASE - December 12, 2025

ARRESTS

- Misdemeanor - (1) Obstructing a Police Officer:** On Saturday, November 8, 2025, at approximately 6:14 P.M., Sergeant William Litterio and Patrolman Derek Adams arrested **Zoe Johnson**, age 23, of 3 Bella Road, Barrington, on a charge of *Obstructing a Police Officer*. The arrest occurred after officers were called to a business on Main Street for a complaint of suspicious activity. When Ms. Johnson was interviewed, she repeatedly provided officers with a fictitious names and dates of birth. When officers finally determined Ms. Johnson's true identity, it was learned that she had an outstanding Superior Court Warrant. Ms. Johnson was taken into custody and transported to the station where she was processed. She was later transported to the ACI Women's Intake Center
- Misdemeanors- DUI (1st offense - BAC of .10 - .15) and (2) Possession of Marijuana More Than an Ounce:** On Wednesday, November 19, 2025, at approximately 08:36 PM, Sergeant William Litterio and Patrolman Ryan Donohue arrested **Ryan Thomas Glenn**, age 25, of 34 Cedar Lane, Norwich, CT on charges of *Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol (1st offense-BAC of .10- .15)* and *(2) Possession of Marijuana Over an Ounce*. Mr. Glenn was arrested after he was stopped for motor vehicle violations on Switch Road. Mr. Glenn was arrested on suspicion of DUI based on officer observations and his performance on a series of standardized field sobriety tests. Mr. Glenn was also found to be in possession of over an ounce of Marijuana. Mr. Glenn was transported to the station where he submitted to a Breathalyzer test that resulted in blood-alcohol-content readings of **.111 (1st phase)** and **.106 (2nd phase)**. Mr. Glenn was processed and arraigned by a Bail Commissioner. He was released on a promise to appear in the 4th Division District Court to be re-arraigned on the charges.
- Misdemeanor- Operating on a Suspended License (4th or Subsequent Offense):** On Monday, December 01, 2025, at approximately 08:49 AM, Sergeant William Litterio summonsed **RaeAna Monroe**, age 29 of 110 Progress Street, Pawtucket to 4th Division District Court for *Operating on a Suspended License (4th Offense)*. Ms. Monroe had been stopped on Richmond Town House Road for a motor vehicle violation.

4. **Misdemeanor- Leaving The Scene Of An Accident With An Attended Vehicle:** On Tuesday, December 02, 2025, at approximately 6:50 PM, Patrolman Paul Marshall and Sergeant William Litterio arrested **Logan Cook**, age 19 of 12 Dye Hill Road, Hopkinton, for *Leaving the Scene of An Accident with An Attended Vehicle*. Officers had responded to Main Street for a two-car motor vehicle accident. It was learned that a pick-up truck that Mr. Cook had been operating, fled the scene of the crash and drove onto 95 South without rendering aid or providing information as required by law. After an investigation, Mr. Cook turned himself at the Richmond Police Station later the same evening. Mr. Cook was Summoned to the 4th Division District Court and Rhode Island Traffic Tribunal to answer to criminal and civil charges
5. **Wayward Juvenile - (1) Simple Assault and (2) Disorderly Conduct:** On Monday, December 08, 2025, a 10-year-old male juvenile from Hopkinton was petitioned to the RI Family Court to answer to a charge of *Simple Assault*. The referral occurred after Sergeant Jeff Vaughn and Patrolman Brock Taylor investigated a complaint of an assault that had occurred at the Chariho Middle School.
