## PRESS RELEASE - November 06, 2025

### ARRESTS

1. **Misdemeanor - Disorderly Conduct:** On Thursday, October 23, 2025, at approximately 9:12 P.M., Patrolman Ryan Donohue and Patrolman Adam Andrukiewicz arrested **Jonathan Lallo**, age 47, of 56 Sherman Ave, Richmond, on a charge of *Disorderly Conduct*. The arrest occurred after officers were called to a residence to remove Mr. Lallo from the property after he had been causing a disturbance there. Mr. Lallo's behavior became more increasingly tumultuous upon officers' arrival on scene, and he was taken into custody. Mr. Lallo was transported to the station where he was processed and released on summons to appear in the 4<sup>th</sup> Division District Court for arraignment on the charge.
2. **Wayward Juvenile - Disorderly Conduct:** On Saturday, November 01, 2025, a 15-year-old juvenile male from Richmond was petitioned to the RI Family Court to answer to a charge of *Disorderly Conduct*. The referral occurred after Sergeant William Litterio, Patrolman Ryan Donohue and Patrolman Derek Adams responded to an underage party. The juvenile was taken into custody and transported to the station after he became unruly and interfered with officers on scene.
3. **Wayward Juvenile - (1) Disorderly Conduct and (2) Obstructing a Police Officer:** On Saturday, November 01, 2025, a 17-year-old juvenile male from Hopkinton was petitioned to the RI Family Court to answer to charges of (1) *Disorderly Conduct* and (2) *Obstructing a Police Officer*. The referral occurred after Sergeant William Litterio, Patrolman Ryan Donohue and Patrolman Derek Adams responded to an underage party. The juvenile was taken into custody after he interfered with officers on scene.
4. **Wayward Juvenile - (1) Disorderly Conduct and (2) Obstructing a Police Officer:** On Saturday, November 01, 2025, a 14-year-old female juvenile from Hopkinton was petitioned to the RI Family Court to answer to charges of (1) *Disorderly Conduct* and (2) *Obstructing a Police Officer*. The referral occurred after Sergeant William Litterio, Patrolman Ryan Donohue and Patrolman Derek Adams responded to an underage party. The juvenile was taken into custody after she interfered with officers on scene.

5. **Misdemeanor - Procurement / Furnishing Alcoholic Beverages For Underage Persons:** On Saturday November 01, 2025, at approximately 9:41 P.M., Sergeant William Litterio summonsed **Bridget Neary-Lawton**, age 50, of 7 Katie Penny Dr., Richmond, to 4<sup>th</sup> District Court on a charge of (1) *Furnishing / Procurement of Alcoholic Beverage to Underage Persons*. Officers had responded to Ms. Neary-Lawton's residence after a 911 call reporting a loud party with possible underage drinking. Upon officers' arrival they observed multiple vehicles parked in the road and driveway. Upon reaching the residence, officers observed numerous juveniles inside an in-law apartment that was attached to the main residence with alcoholic beverages strewn throughout. Hopkinton Police were called to assist in the safe and orderly disbursement of juveniles. It was learned that Ms. Neary-Lawton was home at the time in the main residence while the gathering was going on. Although Ms. Lawton-Neary is not believed to have provided the alcohol, she is alleged to have allowed alcohol to be consumed by minors on the property. She was later given a summons to appear in the 4<sup>th</sup> Division District Court to be arraigned on the charge.
  
6. **Misdemeanors - (1) Criminal Violation of An Order For Protection, and (2) Domestic Vandalism :** On Monday, November 03, 2025, at approximately 3:49 P.M., Patrolman Dan Ballou, Patrolman Ryan Donohue and Patrolman Derek Adams arrested **Ronald A. Pezzullo**, age 52, of 265 Carolina Nooseneck Road, Richmond, on charges of (1) *Violation of an Order for Protection*, and (2) *Domestic Malicious Vandalism*. The arrest occurred after Patrolman Ballou investigated a complaint by the protected party in a Family Court Protection Order. The investigation revealed that Mr. Pezzullo had violated the order and that he had damaged property belonging to the complainant. Mr. Pezzullo had turned himself in at Richmond Police Station where he was processed and arraigned by a Bail Commissioner. Mr. Pezzullo was transported to the Men's Intake Service Unit at the ACI where he was held for re-arraignment in the 4<sup>th</sup> Division District Court on the charge.
