## PRESS RELEASE – February 13, 2026

### ARRESTS

1. **Bench Warrant:** On Wednesday, February 04, 2026, at approximately 4:18 P.M., Sergeant William Litterio and Patrolman Paul Marshall arrested **Jonathan Lallo**, age 48, of 56 Sherman Avenue, Richmond, on the strength of a District Court Bench Warrant for *Failure to Appear for Pre-Trial Conference*. Mr. Lallo was taken into custody at his residence and transported to the Richmond Police Station where he was processed and later brought to the ACI Men's Intake Service Center.
2. **Misdemeanors – (1) Domestic Simple Assault and (2) Domestic Disorderly Conduct:** On Saturday, February 07, 2026, at approximately 11:32 P.M., Corporal Michael Ellis and Patrolman Stephen Blessing arrested **Michael Winsor**, age 64, of 19 Shannock Hill Road, Richmond, on a charges of (1) *Domestic Simple Assault* and (2) *Domestic Disorderly Conduct*. The arrest occurred after officers responded to a 911 call reporting a disturbance at a local residence. Mr. Winsor was taken into custody and transported to the station where he was processed and arraigned by a Bail Commissioner. Mr. Paterson was released on a promise to appear in the 4<sup>th</sup> Division District Court to be re-arraigned on the charge.
3. **Misdemeanor – Criminal Violation of a No-Contact Order:** On Sunday, February 8, 2026, at approximately 10:30 A.M., Corporal Drew Bishop and Patrolman Dan Ballou arrested **Michael Winsor**, age 64, of 19 Shannock Hill Road, Richmond, for *Violation of a Domestic No-Contact Order*. The arrest occurred after officers investigated a complaint regarding the violation of the court order. Mr. Winsor was taken into custody and returned to the station where he was processed and arraigned by a Bail Commissioner. Mr. Winsor was transported to the Adult Correctional Institutions Men's Intake Facility where he was held pending an appearance in the 4<sup>th</sup> Division District Court.

4. **Misdemeanor- Operating on a Suspended License (4th or Subsequent Offense):** On Monday, February 09, 2026, at approximately 3:52 PM, Patrolman Adam Andrukiewicz arrested Roxana Irizarry, age 31 of 54 Highview Ave, Hope Valley, for *Operating on a Suspended License (4<sup>th</sup> Offense)*. Ms. Irizarry was stopped on Stilson Road for a motor vehicle violation. Ms. Irizarry was transported to the Richmond Police Station where she was processed and released on a summons to appear in 4<sup>th</sup> District Court to be arraigned on the charge.
  
5. **Misdemeanor - Domestic- Tracking Device Motor Vehicle:** On Tuesday, February 10, 2026, at approximately 9:06 A.M., Sergeant Jeff Vaughn and Patrolman Dan Ballou arrested **Stephen Scott**, age 50, of 44 Beaver River Road, Richmond, on the strength of an Affidavit and Arrest Warrant for a charge of *Domestic- Tracking Device Motor Vehicle*. The arrest occurred after Corporal Drew Bishop and Patrolman Ryan Donohue investigated a complaint that a tracking device capable of tracking movement and location had been affixed to the complainant's vehicle without their knowledge. Mr. Scott was taken into custody and transported to the station where he was processed. He was later transported to the 4<sup>th</sup> Division District Court to be arraigned on the charge.
